The room is designed to give a more homely environment for patients and their loved ones to have a special space, providing a comfortable setting to allow loved ones all the facilities they may need.

The official opening of the room was attended by members of The Friends of the New Selby War Memorial Hospital in June. A particularly poignant moment came when John Issatt, son of the group's founding member and treasurer, Margaret Sadly, Margaret passed away in May after dedicating many years to fundraising for the hospital.

Lisa Noble, Deputy Sister, of the end-of-life care team in Selby explains:

Following breast cancer surgery, a well-fitting post-surgery bra can be essential for both physical comfort and emotional wellbeing. While some options are available at mainstream stores, they may not always provide the right fit or be financially accessible to everyone.

Our dedicated Breast Care Nurses now offer post-mastectomy bras directly to patients. Located within the Magnolia Centre at York Hospital, our nurses have a comfortable fitting room where patients can receive expert advice and, if needed, be fitted with a bra that best suits their individual poeds.

This new service ensures that every patient has access to the support they deserve during their recovery journey. We're incredibly grateful for your contributions in making this possible!
